




### NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER

#### FREE PROFILE PAGE ACCOUNT

#### Account Type #1



The right place to start for most students!

- » Not sure in which division they plan to compete.
- » <u>Domestic students</u> planning to compete at a Division III school.
- » Registering in an NCAA-certified nonscholastic basketball event.



No registration fee.



If they're being <u>actively recruited</u> by an NCAA Division I or II school, help them <u>transition</u> their Profile Page account to a <u>certification account</u>.



# ACADEMIC AND AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT

**Account Type #2** 



Required to compete at a Division I or II school:

- » Go on Division I official visits.
- » Sign for athletics aid.
- » Receive an athletics scholarship.



#### Registration fee:

- » Domestic students: \$100.
- » International students: \$160.
- » Check to see if they meet fee waiver criteria.



# AMATEURISM-ONLY CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT

**Account Type #3** 



Recommended for all <u>international student-athletes</u> planning to compete at a Division III school.




Registration fee:

- » \$70.
- » Check to see if they meet fee waiver criteria.



Student-athletes transferring from a two-year school to an NCAA Division I or II school who did not require an Eligibility Center academic certification.

Earn 14 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the required subject areas.




Earn a minimum 3.0 core-course GPA.

# **Division I QUALIFIER**



Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the required subject areas.



Complete 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in eight semesters from their initial start of ninth grade.



Meet the <u>10/7 requirement</u> before the start of their seventh semester.

» Not required for students with solely international academic credentials.




Earn a minimum 2.3 core-course GPA.



## DIVISION I: 10/7 REQUIREMENT

Student must complete 10 of their 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits (including seven in English, math or science) before the start of their seventh semester.




» Students with solely <u>international</u> academic credentials (including Canada) are not required to meet the 10/7 requirement.



## DIVISION I: COURSES TAKEN AFTER HIGH SCHOOL

For Division I, only core courses completed in the first eight semesters from the initial start of ninth grade will be used in a student's academic certifications.



If they graduate from high school <u>on time</u>, students may use one core-course unit completed in the year after graduation and before enrolling <u>full time</u> at any college or university.

### **ACADEMIC REDSHIRT**



Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the required subject areas.



Earn a minimum 2.0 core-course GPA.





# Division I NONQUALIFIER



Not eligible to receive athletics aid, practice or compete during their first year of full-time enrollment.



Encourage your students to check with the compliance office at the NCAA school they may attend to discuss their options.



Earn 14 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the required subject areas.



Earn a minimum 2.5 core-course GPA.



### PARTIAL QUALIFIER



May receive athletics aid and practice but may NOT compete during their first year of full-time enrollment.



Encourage your students to check with the compliance office at the NCAA school they may attend to discuss their options.



# EDUCATION-IMPACTING DISABILITIES

- » Current impairment that has a substantial educational impact on a student's academic performance and requires accommodation.
- » Must meet the same initial-eligibility standards as other students but may be provided certain accommodations.
  - Take NCAA-approved courses for students with EIDs.
  - Division I: Take up to three additional core courses after graduating high school, before enrolling full time.
  - Division II: Take an unlimited number of core courses after starting ninth grade, before enrolling full time.

### RECLASSIFYING

- » For Division I, only core courses completed in the first eight semesters from the student's initial start of ninth grade will be used in their academic certification.
  - If they do not graduate on time, the coursework completed after eight semesters would not be used in their certification.
- » To be a Division I qualifier, they must also complete 10 of their 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits (including seven in English, math or science) before the start of their seventh semester.
  - Students with solely <u>international</u> academic credentials (including Canada): Not required to meet 10/7 requirement.
- » Encourage your students to check with the compliance office at the NCAA school they may attend to discuss their options.

\*If you continue to compete on or after Oct. 1 or March 1 (whichever occurs first after the end of your grace period), you risk losing up to one season of NCAA eligibility for each consecutive 12-month period you continue to compete. You may also be required to serve an academic year in residence at your NCAA school before you can compete.

\*\*Competition must be sanctioned by the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association or its international counterparts.

- » After high school graduation, students have a grace period to continue competing in their sports before initially enrolling full time at any two- or four-year college or university.
  - Generally, if they continue to compete in organized competition after their grace period, they risk losing a season of NCAA eligibility for each 12-month period they continue to compete.

### THE CERTIFICATION PROCESS

- Divisions I and II access their Eligibility Center account via MyApps to access Membership Portal on <a href="ncaa.org">ncaa.org</a>.
- PSA registers with appropriate certification account on <u>eligibilitycenter.org</u>.
- 3 NCAA school adds PSA to IRL via Membership Portal.
- PSA submits academic records and requests final amateurism certification.
- Eligibility Center processes amateurism certification review.
- 6 PSA and NCAA school notified of decision.



# WHAT IS THE MEMBERSHIP PORTAL?

- » Your go-to application for most of the activities related to Eligibility Center initial eligibility.
  - Includes information, policies and procedures, tutorials, publications, presentations and forms.






### **MEMBERSHIP PORTAL**

- Activate student-athlete to IRL.
- Monitor progress of specific student-athlete account.
- Update sponsored sports list.
- Access resources, information and support.



### WHO HAS ACCESS TO THE PORTAL?

- » Before your school gets access to the portal, it must have an established Eligibility Center account.
  - If your school has an account, the Eligibility Center Membership Portal tile will appear on your NCAA Applications landing page.
  - No tile? Contact your <u>NCAA applications</u> administrator.





### WHO HAS ACCESS TO THE PORTAL?

- » Your school's NCAA applications administrator can add your name to the list of staff (school's Eligibility Center contacts list).
  - These individuals will interact with the Eligibility Center staff.
  - Eligibility Center staff can share student-specific information only with individuals on this list.
  - Level of access is established by applications administrator.

### **ATHLETICS AID**

- » Upon status change, emails sent within 15 minutes to:
  - o Student.
  - Signing school:
    - > Primary contact.
    - > Any other contact listed whose title includes "compliance."
  - Any other member school that has the student-athlete on their IRL.
- » Email notes student status has been changed to "Signed."
- » Ends other recruiting contact.
- » LMS resources.



### ATHLETICS AID

» Member schools can also remove a "Signed" status within their Eligibility Center account for a signed recruit whose aid has been canceled.



- » Once the signed status has been removed, a similar email notification will be autogenerated to the recruit for awareness of the change to their signed status.
- » Membership Portal: <u>Instructions</u> <u>for changing "Signed" status</u>.
